Supervisor Joe Baca, Jr.

- i. Supervisor Baca gave updates on the \$222 Millon invested by the county for capitol, improvement projects which include the following:
- ii. Infrastructure on Valley Blvd. and other roads in Bloomington which will include ADA ramps, resurfacing, and new traffic markings.
- iii. Construction of 8 new lights to enhance night time visibility. 5 on Otilla St. and 3 on Mallia St.
- iv. New land acquisitions for Bloomington 4.0 to increase affordable housing.
- v. Revitalization for Kessler Pak which will include new lighting, safety corridor fencing, wi-fi, and modern amenities for community enjoyment.
- vi. Funding for Bloomington High's softball and baseball field as well as funding for Joe Baca Middle's soccer field.
- vii. Ayala Nutrition program which allows seniors access to meals and services.
- viii. Installation of a wi-fi hub at Ayala Park
- ix. Launch of a dedicated Bloomington marked public service vehicle.
- x. Community specific Code Enforcement officer.

- Diane Mendez thanks community for their participation. She also expressed immense gratitude to Angela of the Olive Branch for hosting such a successful Women's Empowerment Event.
- Angela McClain expressed wanting information for the man that was hit by a car and killed. She also thanked SWAG for attending as well as requested a follow up on a family that she had referred to SWAG.
- Gary Grossich discussed during the ad hoc committee meeting with code enforcement, multiple violations at the truck stop and the conditions of approval for the project. He mentioned that he had informed Guillermo about these issues and hoped that action would be taken. Gary also brought up a previous request from 2014, where he wanted to determine if Bloomington was financially benefiting or being subsidized by other county agencies. In 2016, a study showed that Bloomington generated approximately \$2.25 million in revenue while the county spent \$5.5 million on services for the community. Gary emphasized the importance of generating revenue and improving public safety for a better quality of life. He also expressed gratitude for everyone's efforts in addressing the homeless situation and roadwork improvement project.
