3. AGENCY STAFF REPORTS (3-5 Minutes)

- a) Supervisor Joe Baca, Jr.'s Office
 - Invitation extended for Kite Day.

 - Ayala Park swings contract approved by the Board of Supervisors; installation forthcoming.

 - State legislative update provided.
- b) State Legislative Update
- c) CHP
 - San Bernardino Office received 10 new officers.
 - Introduction of Officer Alvarez, a Bloomington native.
 - Safety reminder to reduce phone use while driving; residents encouraged to follow CHP on social media for safety updates.
 - Questions & Discussion
 - o Patrol coverage includes Bloomington and the I-10 Freeway.
 - o Typically 1–2 officers assigned to Bloomington depending on availability; patrols occur around 9:00 p.m.
 - o Staffing shortages are being backfilled with new officers.
 - o Request made for an annual or semi-annual report on calls for service in Bloomington at a future meeting.
- d) Code Enforcement
 - Overview of Code Enforcement responsibilities provided.
 - Residents encouraged to report public nuisances at 909-884-4056 or via lus.sbcounty.gov.
 - Notable Updates
 - o 988 Olive Ave: Church roof collapse; boarding and next steps under review.
 - o 19080 Valley Blvd: Inspection related to stolen vehicles.
 - o January activity included 7 food vending citations and 4 assigned court dates.
 - o Truck terminal violation near Taylor resulted in compliance following enforcement.
 - o Car auction site on Valley Blvd addressed.
 - Community & MAC Member Concerns
 - o Homeless encampments and a fire behind Taylor embankment.
 - o Recycling centers on Cedar and Valley not maintaining cleanliness.
 - o Tire dumping reported at Valley & Linden and Locust & Taylor (work orders created; weekend cleanup only).

- o Trailer and motorhome parked along Locust to San Bernardino Ave.
- o Truck parking lot at 1026 Santa Ana Ave addressed; citations issued—new ownership restarts enforcement process.
- o Request to explore DOT saturation enforcement for truck terminals.
- o Discussion on tracking complaints via an electronic mapping system.
- e) Colton Joint Unified School District
 - Community Cabinet Meeting: February 19, 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.
 - Received Golden Bell Award for mental health programs; over 14,000 wellness center visits.
 - Continued focus on science and STEM education.
 - Several students advancing to a national science fair competition.
 - Request made for increased district presence at community events and monthly MAC meetings.
- f) County Fire Department
- g) Sheriff Department
 - Suspect apprehended in recent church fire incident.
 - January 26: Stolen truck containing \$2,500 in equipment recovered using LPR cameras.
 - Introduction of Captain McChristian.
 - Deputy Valencia to assume Bloomington assignment and attend future meetings.
 - Station vacancies filled, allowing for more proactive policing.
 - 2025 Data
 - o Fontana Station covers 129 square miles.
 - o 36,775 calls responded to countywide; 15,000+ calls in Bloomington alone.
- h) Special District
- i) West Valley Water District
 - Maintains 1,500 fire hydrants in Bloomington; inspected regularly.
 - Bloomington Main Alleyway Project began construction in December; expected completion by end of summer.
 - Discussion
 - o Inactive hydrants are bagged and fire department notified.
 - o Water quality is not expected to be impacted; all pipes will be cleaned and disinfected before activation.
 - o Community concerns will be reviewed following construction completion.

4. INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION

- Bloomington Roadwork Improvements Project- Bob Vezutto
 - o Locust Ave. closed until April 2026
 - o Jurupa Ave. partial closure from Oct. 2025 – July 2026
 - o 11th St. improvements to be complete by March 2026
 - o Armstrong full closure from April 2026 – Aug. 2026 (final phase)
 - o Residents will continue to be updated on closures via direct mail and email
- Water Hydrant System - West Valley Water District - presented during Agency Staff Reports
- Colton Joint Unified School District
 - o Relocation delayed due to litigation.
 - o Project transferred from Howard to Brookfield; Brookfield has not committed to honoring the \$44.5 million agreement.
 - o Public Comment & Discussion
 - Concerns raised about proximity to truck routes and pollution impacts.
 - CJUSD stated it is now opposing the project.
 - District requested community and MAC support in urging the Board of Supervisors to deny the project.
 - CJUSD committed to continued community engagement and collaboration.
 - District noted opposition to truck routes, advocacy for pedestrian bridges, free student transportation, and funding an additional sheriff deputy (\$350,000 annually).
 - CJUSD confirmed intent to continue litigation if necessary and reiterated commitment to building a state-of-the-art school.
